

PIVOTAL MOMENTS LEADER SELF-ASSESSMENT

Discerning, Aligning, and Leading with Purpose

“Teach us to number our days, that we may gain a heart of wisdom.”

HOW TO USE THIS ASSESSMENT

Set aside **20–30 minutes** of uninterrupted time.

Answer honestly—this is a **clarity tool**, not a performance review.

Use the following scale:

1 – Strongly Disagree

2 – Disagree

3 – Neutral / Unsure

4 – Agree

5 – Strongly Agree

SECTION 1: AWARENESS OF PIVOTAL MOMENTS

Purpose: To assess your ability to recognize when God may be inviting you into a pivotal moment.

1. I notice when decisions carry unusual emotional or spiritual weight.
2. I pay attention to patterns rather than isolated events.
3. I recognize when pressure is pushing me toward compromise.
4. I can discern the difference between fear and lack of peace.
5. I regularly reflect on how current decisions may shape future direction.
6. I pause to ask what God might be doing *through* a challenge, not just *around* it.

Scoring Insight:

- **24–30:** Strong spiritual awareness
- **18–23:** Developing awareness
- **Below 18:** Risk of missing key moments

SECTION 2: ALIGNMENT WITH VALUES AND CALLING

Purpose: To measure how well your decisions align with biblical values and personal calling.

7. My business decisions reflect my stated Christian values.
8. I rarely feel internal conflict between success and obedience.
9. I have clearly defined non-negotiables guiding my leadership.
10. I prioritize faithfulness over short-term results.
11. I believe obedience is success—even when outcomes are unclear.
12. My leadership reflects who I am becoming in Christ.

Scoring Insight:

- **24–30:** High alignment
- **18–23:** Partial alignment
- **Below 18:** Misalignment warning

SECTION 3: RESPONSE TO PRESSURE AND DECISION-MAKING

Purpose: To identify how you respond when pivotal moments apply pressure.

13. I pause before making high-impact decisions.
14. I seek godly counsel during major transitions.
15. I avoid isolating when under stress.
16. I resist urgency that pushes me past discernment.
17. I can say “no” to opportunities that are misaligned.
18. I don’t confuse open doors with God’s direction.

Scoring Insight:

- **24–30:** Mature decision-making
- **18–23:** Inconsistent practices
- **Below 18:** Reaction-driven leadership

SECTION 4: OBEDIENCE AND TRUST

Purpose: To assess your willingness to align with God in pivotal moments.

19. I act on conviction even when it costs me.
20. I don’t delay obedience while waiting for certainty.
21. I trust God with outcomes beyond my control.
22. I release control when God asks me to surrender something.
23. I measure success by faithfulness, not just results.
24. I believe God is faithful even when obedience is costly.

Scoring Insight:

- **24–30:** Deep trust
- **18–23:** Growing trust
- **Below 18:** Control or fear may be present

SECTION 5: OVERALL REFLECTION

Add your total score (Maximum: **120**)

- **96–120:** You are likely discerning and stewarding pivotal moments well
- **72–95:** You are growing, but may need intentional alignment
- **Below 72:** God may be inviting you into a season of reflection and recalibration

2. What decision feels heavy right now—and why?
3. Where do I sense tension between growth and obedience?
4. What might God be asking me to release or realign?
